- A. Ever heard the expression "Hindsight 2020"
 - 1. 2020 gives that new meaning!
- B. Q. How can you make God laugh?
 - A. Tell him your plans.
- C. <u>Pastoral Pause</u>: Could COVID be judgement?
 - 1. Don't be too dismissive.
- 2. What is God trying to speak to us/our nation right now?

II. Context

- A. Ch. 32 is the story of the Golden Calf.
 - 1. Exodus 31:18 "When the Lord finished speaking to Moses on Mount Sinai, he gave him the two tablets of the covenant law, the tablets of stone inscribed by the finger of God."
 - 2. Moses was up on the Mt w/ God.
 - 3. <u>Pastoral Pause</u>: Some times we need to get away and up on the mt w/ God!
- B. They got restless and made for themselves a god... golden calf.
- C. Moses came down the mt and was so angry when he saw what had happened that he

- threw the stone tablets down breaking them into pieces.
- 1. He melted down the golden calf, ground into powder, sprinkled it in the water, & made them drink it.
- 2. Then he rebuked Aaron for leading them poorly.(Note: Leaders are judged for going along with the whims of the crowd too.)
- 3. v. 25 "Moses saw that the people were running wild and that Aaron had let them get out of control and so become a laughingstock to their enemies."
- 4. Moses asked them to declare their allegiance to God. (3000 ppl were executed).
- D. vv. 30-33 "The next day Moses said to the people, 'You have committed a great sin. But now I will go up to the Lord; perhaps I can make atonement for your sin.' [31] So Moses went back to the Lord and said, 'Oh, what a great sin these people have committed! They have made themselves gods of gold. [32] But now, please forgive their sin—but if not, then blot me out of the

book you have written.'

- [33] The Lord replied to Moses, 'Whoever has sinned against me I will blot out of my book."
- 1. Sin is serious to God.
- 2. Repentance is essential to atonement.
- 3. Sin has consequences.

III. Scripture: Exodus 33:1-18 A. After Genesis and before Leviticus in the OT.

IV. Exposition

vv. 1-3

- A. God sends them on into the promised land.
- B. An angel is going before them to drive out the enemy.
- C. An angel? That is awesome!
- D. But He will not go with them. vv. 4-6
 - A. They began to mourn when they heard the news.
 - 1. They did not put on jewelry or dress up.
 - 2. They "stripped off their ornaments at Mt Horeb."
 - B. What is their concern? *That*God will not be going with them.
 - 1. Though the outcome would still be their dominance.
 - 2. They would possess the land.
 - 3. The angel would drive out the enemy.

vv. 7-11

- A. Tent of meeting.
- B. When there was physical

- evidence of the presence of God, the ppl would stand at their front door and worship.
- C. v. 11a "The Lord would speak with Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend."
- vv. 12-18 (We get to listen in on an intimate conversation between God and his servant Moses.)
 - A. v. 12-13 Moses pleads w/ God to teach him out to please the Lord and lead the ppl.
 - B. v. 14, God says His presence will go with Moses and give him rest.
 - C. v. 15-16 "If your Presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here."
 - D. v. 17-18
 - 1. "I will do the very thing you have asked, because I am pleased with you and I know you by name."
 - 2. "Now show me your glory."

 - 1. I'm not going to settle for a good attendance.
 - 2. ...everyone being happy or content.
 - 3. ...earthly measures of success.
 - 4. I want the presence of God to go with me!
- F. Pastoral Pause: Don't look back (good or bad), but look forward and just imagine what might happen if the presence of God goes with us!
- G. Will you join me?
 - 1. Repent
 - 2. Re-prioritize "needs"
 - 3. Plead for His presence.
